

# **TESTING AND ASSESSMENT**

Teachers are continually assessing children through questioning and reviewing their work. Records of progress are kept in order that we can plan lessons, which match each child's needs and ability.

Formal tests are taken at specific points in line with L.E.A. and Government requirements. Year 2 children (at the end of Key Stage One) are assessed on their progress within the National Curriculum through S.A.Ts (Standard Assessment Tasks). Year 6 pupils (at the end of Key Stage Two) take Standard Assessment Tests. Test results are reported to parents and used by the school to monitor our standards. You can see the latest set of results on a separate sheet enclosed with this brochure. Children in Years 3, 4 and 5 take the Optional S.A.Ts (Standard Assessment Tasks)

## **PUPIL ACHIEVEMENTS**

You will want to know how your child is progressing at school. We intend to keep you fully informed as we view education as a partnership between home and school. You may view your child's work when mutually convenient. (The end of the school day is the most convenient time but other times can be arranged).

We hold Consultation Evenings twice a year to discuss the progress of your son/daughter. These operate on an appointment system and allow time for discussion and a review of your child's work. We also hold an Open Afternoon, usually in the spring term when your child will be able to share their work with you. However, teachers will be available to talk to you at other times (but please remember that the start of the school day is not a suitable time for a worthwhile discussion).

We will send home a detailed report at the end of each Academic Year.
